Nominations:

The Borough requests your cooperation in nominating candidates for the next edition of this very special event.

Please send us your nominations by email or by mail, at Lennoxville Borough, 150 Queen Street, Sherbrooke, J1M 1J6, by filling out the form on the back. All nominations must include the names of persons or groups of persons who you feel deserve the award, the category they are nominated for and a written text of 400 to 500 words of the reasons for their nomination.

Please note that the achievements must have taken place during the year 2016 and have had a positive impact on the community or taken place in the Borough. Nominees do not have to be residents of the Borough of Lennoxville.

Categories:

Donald-Patrick Award: Award presented for exceptional services to the community. It serves as a memorial to the late Donald Patrick, long-time owner of Patrick Pharmacy and well known for his support of numerous causes, especially those assisting the sick.

Arts and culture: The performing arts, fine arts and writing are covered in this category. The Borough of Lennoxville should be the scene of the action or be promoted in or by the work of the nominee.

Citizenship and volunteer work: Any volunteer or group of volunteers who have contributed, by their hard work and commitment, to the improvement of the Borough population's quality of life.

Business development: Any business that has contributed to the improvement of the Borough's economic status by offering new or improved services and/or products.

Urbanism: Any exceptional contributions to the construction or restoration of a building and/or property, which contributes to the improvement of the Borough's scenery, as well as any action or effort to beautify the Borough or improve the cleanliness.

Sports: Any athlete, team or coach who has achieved an outstanding performance.

Education: Any volunteer, professional or group of people involved in the offering of an academic program which resulted in enhanced and improved knowledge.

Lennoxville volunteer firefighters heroism: The category recognizes any act that calls for human action to aid an endangered fellow human, animal or property.

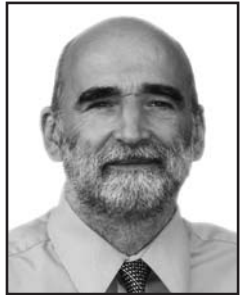

Ombuds...what? Ombudsman

The Sherbrooke Ombudsman's service is an organization that was created five years ago and is now located in the same building as your borough office in Lennoxville, at 150 Queen Street, Suite 111. When you believe your rights have been violated or if you think you may be affected by a decision or omission of the City, and after taking all the administrative steps within the concerned department, you may contact the Office of the Ombudsman. The Ombudsman's service intervenes as a last resort, at the request of citizens, when there is a problem between them and the City. We receive and process your requests in complete confidentiality, with the utmost respect. Using the Ombudsman's services is free of charge. The Office of the Ombudsman is independent of the municipal ad-

ministration, and it works autonomously and with neutrality. It reports to the municipal council to which it must present an annual report of its activities. You will find our annual report on our website at the following address: <http://ombudsmansherbrooke.ca/>.

On the other hand, the Office of the Ombudsman cannot act in your file as a lawyer, by representing you, since his intervention must be done impartially. We have a duty to analyze the whole situation from both the citizen's point of view and the City's point of view. We work towards a solution that is satisfactory for all. If, after analyzing your request, we find it is not within our jurisdiction, we will refer you to the appropriate resource. We look forward to meeting you and working with you.

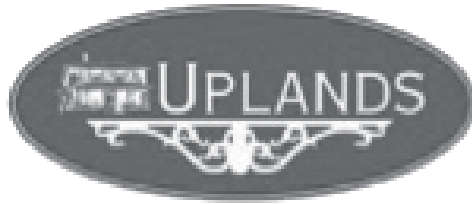
